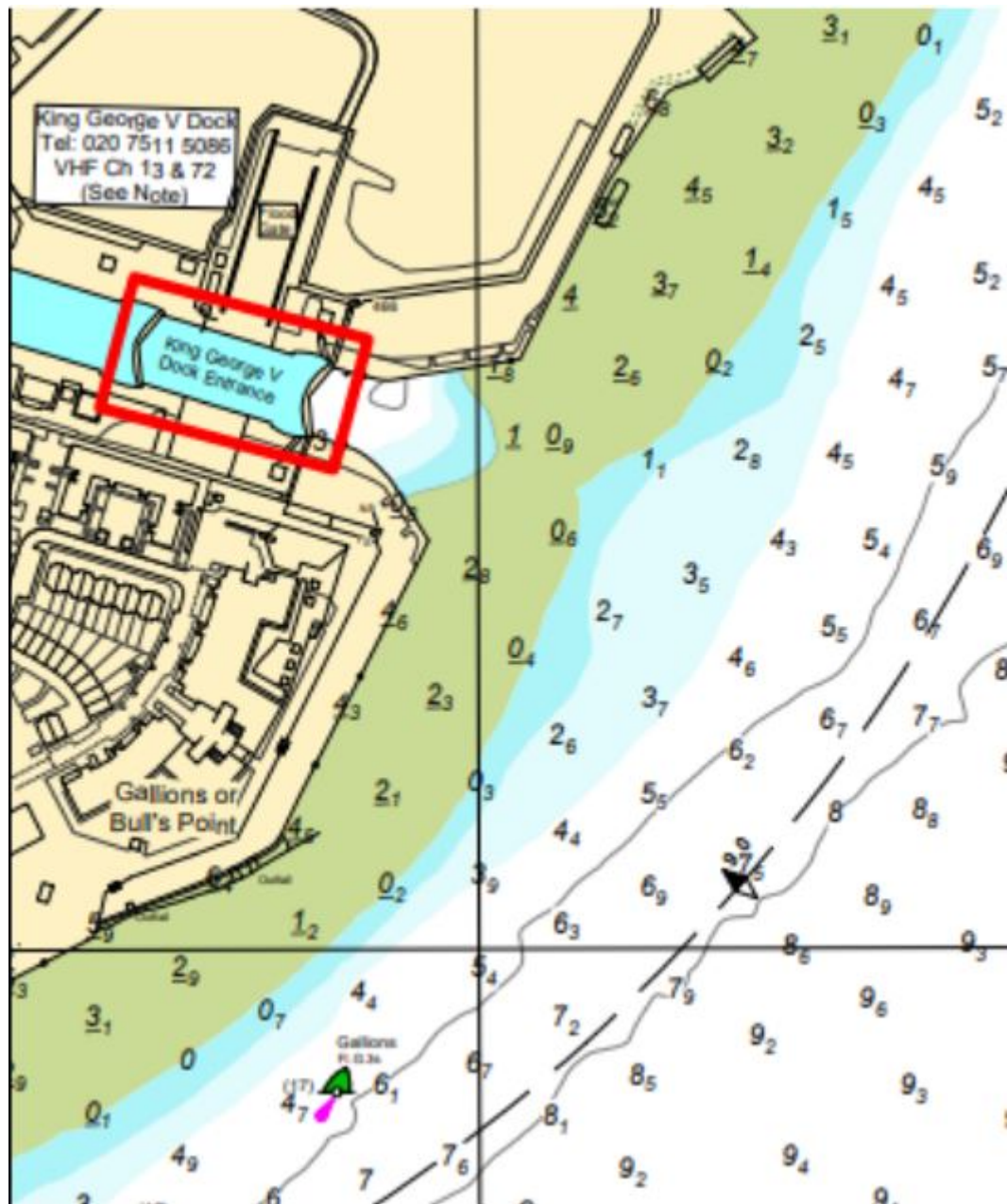

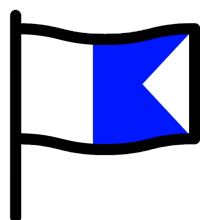
NOTICE TO MARINERS

By day, International Code Flags 'Romeo Yankee (RY)', 'Alpha (A)' and a red flag near the diver's point of entry into the water.

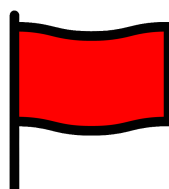
By night, illuminated rigid replicas of the International Code Flags 'Romeo Yankee (RY)' and 'Alpha (A)'.

Any requirements to proceed with caution or at slow speed, will be made in accordance with the procedures set out in the Port of London Authority's [Port Information Guide](#), under 'London VTS', 'Section 4' with the International Code Flags 'Romeo Yankee' displayed, which are illustrated above.

The display of these signals will be in addition to any lights or shapes required under local regulations and the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea.

Further details will be broadcast by **London VTS** on VHF Channel **14**.
