#### **2024 Highlights**

- A working river, home to the UK's largest port and busiest inland waterway, on track for Net Zero by 2040
- Advancing the UK government's growth agenda and contributing over £4 billion gross value added
- Improving water quality through cleaning efforts, gaining commitments from water companies and supporting the connection of the Thames Tideway Tunnel



#### **Governance & accountability**

- Accountable to Department for Transport and board members appointed by Secretary of State
- Held to account through public meetings, stakeholder forum, river user groups and subject specific meetings
- The annual stakeholder survey showed ongoing support on:
  - Safety
  - Growth including light freight initiatives
  - Community and cultural engagement
  - Sustainability

- 1 Serious Navigational incident
- New edition of the Tideway Code issued
- Completed first year of Marine Safety Plan
- Thames Continuing Professional Development scheme with TSA introduced and safety strategy refresh planned for 2025
- 2 x District Harbour Master Teams
- Refreshed Operation CLASP Class V river compliance checks
- Regular tree management works to ensure public and river user safety, with £160,000 invested in 2024
- Encourage Near Miss and Incident Reporting







#### **Trade Outlook**

- London Gateway Berth 4 is fully operational with consenting for Berth 5 now underway and Berth 6 in planning
- New 'Gemini Alliance' (Maersk and Hapag-Lloyd) first call at London Gateway March 2025
- Port of Tilbury 'Tilbury3' expansion planning application submitted
- Cory Decarbonisation Project Development Consent Order decision expected November 2025



#### **Trading Thames – Supported by PLA**

- £9m Marine Centre Transformation Programme, including a new Operations Centre: anticipating next 25 years of growth
- Other Major Investment Projects:
  - Denton development works
  - Mid-size multi-purpose vessel, Thames oil spill clearance vessel and new pilot cutter
  - Radar replacement programme
- Ongoing investment in pilot training
- Key role in consenting infrastructure projects on the Thames



## DESTINATION THAMES



#### **Promoting and Diversifying River Usage**

- Tidal Thames Masterplans available across 8 boroughs, with 5 more in progress this year
- Thames Festival Trust programme sponsorship:
  - Totally Thames
  - Thames Lens
- Funding Thames Explorer Trust since 2008
- Charitable donations and support at Ellenor Hospice,
   Bridge Watch, Gravesham Foodbank and more
- Hosted 'Santa on the Thames', offering Evelina
   Children's Hospital patients, families and staff a festive boat ride in partnership with Uber Boat by Thames
   Clippers and Tideway



#### **Active Thames Fund**

- Promoting the active use of blue space with a focus on accessibility and inclusion
- Active Thames Impact Report 2024 published:
  - £193,535 awarded
  - 3826 participants
  - 158 coaches trained and upskilled
  - 982 people with a disability or physical or mental health conditions
  - **3178** were under the age of 25
  - 2077 were from a minority ethnic background
- Development of social value measurement for future years



## NATURAL THAMES



#### **Clean River**

- 25km Thames Tideway Tunnel, a 15-year project for the PLA as consultee and regulator, is now connected
  - No spills have entered the river since the super sewer has opened
- Clean Thames Plan Parliamentary launch, outlining 10 priority actions to reduce sewage, litter and pollution in the tidal Thames
- Working on a project to clean up the wet wipe accumulations at Hammersmith
- Passive debris collectors deployed along the Tidal Thames capturing litter and making progress towards a cleaner, healthier river




#### **Biodiverse River**

- The tidal Thames is home to over-wintering birds, marine and terrestrial mammals, invertebrates, 125 fish species, and diverse plants
- The PLA records environmental observations, including incidents, near misses, and species sightings
- Ensuring new developments positively impact ecosystems, achieving 10% Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) on-site or off-site



#### **Net Zero River**

- PLA Net Zero River Action Plan decarbonising PLA operations
  - Aim to be Net Zero by 2040
  - Transitioned vessel fleet to Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO), resulting in 83% decrease in vessel emissions
  - Vehicle fleet electrification
- Net Zero River Plan facilitating the decarbonisation of the working river
  - Transition to alternative fuels and infrastructure
  - Launched Net Zero Coalition
  - Unlock funding
- Partnership with the Electric Thames initiative, led by UK Power Networks
- £129,000 awarded (to date) through the Environment Fund



## FINANCE AND REGULATORY UPDATES



#### **Financial Performance**

- 2024 turnover grew **9.8%** to **£99.7m**
- **£10.9m** PLA and ESL cash capital investment
- ◆ Operating surplus rose to £17.8m
  - **5-10%** was spent on charitable donations, sponsorship, business and community benefits



#### Harbour Revision Order (HRO)

- In 2019, the PLA sought a Harbour Revision Order to update 60-year-old legislation to help keep ships, people, and the environment safe
- Measures to modernise approach, to improve safety and the environment and to increase transparency and decision making.
- PLA and the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) have been consulting and seeking evidence; majority of stakeholders' concerns addressed through that process
- MMO set public inquiry (Feb/March 2025) to consider any remaining concerns
- PLA awaiting report and recommendations from inquiry Chair and MMO
- Committed to looking again at our approach to charging for domestic balconies following feedback received, on which we continue to engage with stakeholders
